In this month's "Ponderings" I want to first express our profound appreciation and thanksgiving for the various forms of loving, kind, sympathetic and caring ways that you shared your support of us during the past month. Your prayers, cards, hugs, memorial gifts and more have been a Godsend in this time of mourning.

For any who may not be aware, our family continues grieving the death of my dad, Paul Jackson Way, Sr. Additionally, we are still staggering from the horrifying murders of our two great nephews, Benjamin 7, and Sebastian, 5. Because of the unhealthy parental situation, for nearly all of the past 5 years, the boys have been under the guardianship of my brother and sister-in-law. There is a suspect arrested who is charged with the deaths of these boys. The boys were intentionally murdered along with the troubled, bad-decision making young man who was their dad. Significant details are still under wraps while the murder investigation by law enforcement continues. Your prayers continue to be of comfort to us and to our extended family. Thank you!

Next, I have such emotional feelings about the ways that so many of the various leaders at Redeemer were supportive in our time of crisis. Council president Chad Risgaard was such a steady and comforting support as we figured out what was best for me and our extended family.

Chad then worked with the worship team consisting of Kristi Fehrman, Geri Gorman, and Claudine Hanson, as well as, with Bishop Joy Mortenson-Weibe and the Synod staff. Together they arranged for everything that needed to be done in my absence for Christmas Eve and and the Sunday of Christmas weekend. The Rev. Cindy Crane from the Synod office stepped in as preacher and presider. Together, with all of their prayers for us, we were relieved from the duty and the worry and the burden of having to make arrangements for my/our replacement during such an important week in our faith lives. The celebration of God becoming incarnate in the birth of Jesus.

Additionally, many, many behind the scenes details were completed by the worship team, by council members and others of you with very little awareness among the congregation that all of this was done last minute during the week of Christmas Eve. To any and all of you who helped - Thank you, Thank YOU!!!

To the others of you who called us, emailed us, texted us, sent us cards of sympathy and messages of kind and caring Christian love to us throughout the weight of and the blur of our overwhelming grief during this past month – you have been such blessings to us – Thank you! God be with you!

Words. In this time spoken words seem inadequate. Yet, God's love to God's people repeatedly offers us redemption and restoration. It is God's gracious eternal offering. God's love becomes flesh so we might better understand the height, and the depth, and the breadth of God's infinite compassion for us. No matter what befalls us in life, our hope is always in the promise of God's unending faithfulness. The promise is real that God, in Christ Jesus, is with us beyond even death, to the end of the ages. The resurrection always delivers.
