Pastor Ponderings Pastor Jack Way ******

Wow! There have been quite the changes in weather this past week or so, with more changes ahead. The fall colors are getting more gorgeous by the day as I travel between home and church. The Creator is doing an outstanding job with the wondrous hues, and the tones of a magnificent, wondrous palette. I love this time of year for the snap of the air, the aromas of harvest and the scent of humus from the turning of soils. There is something elemental and sacred in those fragrances.

Reformation Sunday approaches rapidly as we celebrate on October 30th. The red color, that we invite you to wear on that Sunday, is a reminder of the action of God's Holy Spirit as she constantly renews God's church in the world. Red represents fire and is the symbolic color the church has used for representing the presence of the Holy Spirit among us. The use of fire as Holy Spirit reminds us of when the disciples in Jerusalem were hearing and speaking in multiple languages while tongues of fire immerse them. Red is used in limited places during the church's liturgical year. Red is used as the color of the altar cloths, on the pulpit and the lectionary cloths, on the pastor's stole and is used in banners for the festival days. Pentecost, which is celebrated as the "birthday of the church when those tongues of fire were upon the disciples" takes place in late spring. Red is used on Reformation Sunday for the celebration of the birth of Protestantism, that includes us Lutherans and many, many more Protestants. It is on the last Sunday in October. Congregations often use red on confirmation Sunday, when young adults affirm their baptismal promises, and the Holy Spirit is present and active. The color of red is used on the days when a newly ordained pastor or deacon is consecrated by the universal church.

As I continue adding to the number of times I have traveled around the sun, and when, as I experience the amazing fall seasonal colors and as I think of the many colors of fire, I sometimes feel we limit the wide varieties of color included in fire. The multitude of ranges of those orange, yellow, brown, gold, purple, violet and more tints we have seen in fire, suggest to me that maybe we can wear more variety when we celebrate on Red Sundays. For when we celebrate the Holy Spirit, I feel we can at least consider wearing as many different shades as were in Joseph's coat of many colors. Just a thought you can ponder, for if you forget to wear red on Reformation Sunday, you are likely already clothed in one of the host of colors of the Holy Spirit.

You can read elsewhere in the newsletter, or you may have read it in your weekly bulletin, about remembering and honoring before God your loved ones who have finished their baptismal calling and entered through the gates of eternity into the sacred arms of Jesus. For those saints who were connected to Redeemer and who have entered God's kingdom between last All Saints Sunday, November 7, 2022, and this All Saints Sunday, November 6. 2022, we will name each and every one, we will light a candle in their memory and ring a bell for them. For those saints from elsewhere that you want to remember, or from their deaths occurring during a time other than this past 12 months, you can come forward to light a candle in loving memory of them. You can light one candle for all of the saints you are honoring, or you can light a candle for each individual

saint you are remembering before God.

The call committee and the council will meet with Marie Leafblad, the Assistant with the Bishop for Leadership, from our Synod office. We are working to arrange a date and time in the near future for Marie to meet with both the council and call committee together. This can be complicated with so many individual calendars and schedules to correlate. Two dates are tentatively possible before the end of October.

November 13th will be a significant day for Lucy Agnew, who will be baptized during worship that Sunday! Lucy is the daughter of Samantha Jaynes and Adam Agnew. She is the little sister of Leslie Berndt. Because of my having Covid at the end of September and into October making me unavailable, we have rescheduled the first communion for Emily Laufenberg and Emma Dahnke and for their families to celebrate together on November 13th. Additionally, on that Sunday, 11/13, we will again offer communion at the rail for those that choose to do so. Pre-packaged communion will be offered, as well. You may choose having either grape juice with a wafer, or wine along with a wafer. Persons wanting to receive communion from their pews may use either of those pre-packaged options. We will also return to having ushers pass the offering plate to worshippers in the pews. Those that choose not to do that are welcome to drop their offerings into the offering plates before worship begins, or after worship.

Fall Festival information is in the newsletter, the quilters are requesting materials in the newsletter, the Women of the ELCA met today and the board will meet again in November to recruit and elect a couple of new officers, the bell choir played with their new recruits last Sunday, the senior choir has been singing since September, there is an Ecumenical Thanksgiving Eve worship in the newsletter, the kitchen is being worked on, plans are starting to form for Music Sunday before Christmas, ushers and communion assistants will soon be serving, Sprouts have started and will be lighting the Advent wreath candles in late November and into December. There is more than I can list here that gets done because of so many of you participating. Thanks to you, who are the many that serve because you love Jesus and you steward his church, the people the Lord loves and the world God adores.

Praise the Lord, this is a wonderful time to be the church. Thanks be to God.

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Financially speaking....

As a member in the pew the last thing I wanted to hear was a sermon on money... But the apostle Paul did say we needed to support the disciples in their mission so here it goes.

The hard cold facts, recently our church has overextended its budget by \$2,250, beginning with the summer months and continuing through September. Sadly, we are moving funds from interest earned on various accounts to make ends meet.

Now how do we overcome this issue? We tighten our belts and get frugal? Well, sadly, we have done much of this already.

Option 1:

We fund raise, ie bake sales, craft sales, salad luncheons, pancake breakfasts, as we did in past

Option 2:

We ensure we are timely giving (many of us are, so this may not be an option).

Option 3:

We continue to reach out to our community and invite them to church and let go and let God...and pray that with the wonderful message and services we provide many will be drawn to become a member and contribute to the church

Option 4

We recruit volunteers to help throughout the church. Restart and rejuvenate our former committees and encourage participation of new, former and current members.

Note a contribution may simply be volunteering to help at church as many of you already do. <u>And this is also a huge contribution</u> <u>more valuable than finance</u>. Many of you quietly work long hours behind the scenes never asking for recognition. Just know we value you greatly!!!



Why have I brought up this difficult topic??? Many of you have voiced the need for a full-time pastor at our November 2 special membership meeting when approving our new call committee. Sadly, at present we will need to focus on all the above options in order to afford to hire a full-time pastor. Currently, Pastor Jack is a 1/2-time pastor

In the interest of ongoing transparency, the council has approved the re-introduction of including the previous week's giving and expenses for that week to be shown in the weekly budget. This is not a new idea, but rather a practice that was done for years at Redeemer Lutheran.

With the above in mind, I have been led to the following scripture, 1 John 5:11-15, with the theme of LET GO AND LET GOD.

The apostle John stated, "11 And the testimony is this, that God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. 12 The one who has the Son has the life; the one who does not have the Son of God does not have the life. 13 These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life. 14 This is the confidence which we have before Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. 15 And if we know that He hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests which we have asked from Him

There are 8 different items in each kit. Just organizing the items for over 100 kits was very time-consuming. Sets of 5 pens and 5 pencils must each be rubber banded together and school kit bags have to be ordered. Beth had everything laid out in 8 piles on the table Sunday after church when we put the kits together. A lot of the items were donated, but Beth had to count and purchase through donated money – items that were needed to fill all the 104 kits. Everything worked out like clockwork. We were done in less than an hour. Amazing!!

Thanks to Lynn Bubolz and Lola Bortz for volunteering to haul the 20 boxes of kits and quilts to

Madison to be placed in box cars where they are sent to the east coast and eventually shipped to third world countries.
