Things are humming away at Redeemer...

Bishop Joy Mortensen-Wiebe joined us on July 6th for the installation of Pastor Anne. This was a very exciting day. Thank you to everyone that attended the service. It was great to see so many in attendance. The brunch was also very good. Thank you to everyone that donated food and helped in various other ways.

A new AED (defibrillator) has been purchased and installed. Our old AED was 10 years old and beeping indicating it needed a new battery. After researching the cost of a new battery versus the cost of a new AED, and considering the age of our old one, council approved the purchase of a new AED.

Work has started on the new boiler. Actually, it is two smaller boilers. The new boilers are currently sitting in a Sunday School room in the basement. The big old boiler is still in the boiler room but has been disconnected. I am hopeful it will be removed soon. It is not an easy task to remove due to



its weight and size. As of 7/7/2025, we have paid Paul Heating & Cooling \$25,375 (total project cost is \$41,500). See information in the newsletter around ongoing fundraising.

Davis Construction will be crack filling, seal coating, and marking the lines on the parking lot this summer. We do not know when they will be onsite to complete the work and expect to only get a day or two notice of their arrival. If you see the parking lot blocked off, please do not park in it.

This year for God's Work, Our Hand's Sunday in September, we will again be assembling school kits. Please see more on this in the newsletter.

Review/Approve Minutes from: April 22, 2025 council meeting.

Motion was made by Pastor Anne Wickland to approve the April 22, 2025 council meeting minutes. Seconded by Steve Gilbert. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Boiler Project – Update/Review/approve

a. Bids -

Motion was made by Lynn Bubolz to approve the bid from Paul Heating & Cooling to replace the church existing boiler system for \$41,500 (\$40,000 included in 2025 Spending Plan). Seconded by Pastor Anne Wickland. Roll call vote was taken. There were 7 yes votes and zero no votes. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Lynn Bubolz to approve the bid from Paul Heating & Cooling to replace zone valves located throughout the church building for \$2,600 (\$200 included in 2025 Spending Plan for Boiler Maintenance). Seconded by Pastor Anne Wickland. All were in favor. Motion carried.

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Boiler Funding Update


Fundraising continues. See breakdown below as a reminder of how we plan to pay for the boiler project.

As of 7/7/2025, \$8,234 has been raised toward the \$15,000 fundraising/donations goal. This includes member donations as well as money generated from the Easter Breakfast, Culver's fundraiser (\$423), and cobalt glass and woodworking sales. We are 55% of the way there.

As of 7/7/2025, Redeemer's members have matched \$4,950 of the \$5,000 Thrivent Choice Challenge.

Lastly, included in the existing church funds, is a generous memorial (\$4,965) from the Family of Donna Kearney designated for the boiler project.

Fundraising for the New Boiler

We currently have 3 Boiler Fund-raising projects:

- **2)** Church Pew Sales: We have a number of church pews currently stored at the parsonage that are being offered for sale. All that is left at this time are the 12-foot pews. 3) Barb Nelson's Cobalt Blue Glassware Collection: Barb has donated her Cobalt Blue glassware collection to Redeemer as a Fund-Raiser for the boiler. There are many pieces, including fancy vases, stemmed glasses, bowls, candleholders, creamers, salt & pepper shakers, candy dishes, and the list goes on.
