Can you believe that it's already September? It feels like just a couple weeks ago we started summer! While the school year starts this week for many, that also means that many things are starting again at Redeemer. Senior Choir will return this month, as well as the Bell Choir, Confirmation starts up again next week. I'm hopeful to get a Bible study set up, even if it's just once a month because I always have interesting conversations after worship with people about the Gospel or my sermon, so it would be great to offer a space to dive deeper into scripture, whether that be the weekly texts or following a book of the Bible.

I did not lead worship this past Sunday, but at our Worship Team meeting I heard about how it went – we didn't have a musician so we broke out the chimes. Chimes and music were dispersed to the crowd and all of you were the musicians for Sunday worship. I was told that it took a little bit to get the hang of it, but that you all came together to worship God. To worship God and to do what was needed to have "the show go on". Even when I first started preaching here, one of the things I admired was that even when faced with not having a musician or having a supply pastor, you all adapted and all that you could to bring worship together. If there's a flub by me forgetting my place in the reading, needing to use my laptop because I could get my sermon to print, or the music starting too early in the communion liturgy, you've all laughed along and moved onto the next part of worship! Because at the end of the day, no matter what happens, we have all worshiped God together. I feel like by embracing our need for creativity, we've broken down walls of what worship is "supposed" to look like, and welcomed worship for what it truly is—a group of people gathering together to praise God, give thanks for God, ask God for forgiveness, pray to God. A community coming together to love God, learn from Jesus, and work towards bringing the Kingdom of God to us here on Earth. Sometimes focusing on where to stand or which candle needs to be lit detracts from worshiping God. When we focus on being "perfect" for God, we lose sight of who God really is. Our God is gracious—we are saved by faith through grace and thank God for that! We don't need to be perfect, we just need to love God, love others, and do our best to help our neighbors with open hearts and open minds.

This is the first newsletter where we will include our Ongoing Prayer List here and just have listed our Immediate Concerns Prayer List in our worship bulletin. We are not getting rid of our ongoing prayer list, it will just be in this newsletter and our newsletters to follow while immediate concerns will stay in our weekly worship. FROM THE PRESIDENT

It is back to school time. Which also means some activities that took a break for the summer are starting up again at Redeemer. Confirmation classes will begin Wednesday, September 10th at 7pm. The Senior Choir and Bell Choir start practicing and sharing their talents.

On Sunday, September 7th in celebration of God's Work, Our Hands Sunday, we will assemble school kits for Lutheran World Relief after the worship service in the fellowship hall. Please come and join us. Fellowship will be served in the Fellowship Hall once the kits have been assembled.

Thank you to everyone that came out to Texas Roadhouse to support the Boiler Fundraiser. As of 9/2/2025, I do not know how much was raised but will share that information once it becomes available. Also, thank you to everyone who helped with the Street Dance Parade Float and handed out fliers to advertise the event.

Work continues on the new boiler system. As of 9/2/2025 we still need to raise \$3,603 to meet our \$15,000 donation and fundraising goal. See additional information in the newsletter around ongoing efforts to raise funds. If you have not already donated or would like to donate more to the boiler project, please get that in ASAP. We hope the new boilers will be fully installed and operational very soon, as the heating season is quickly approaching.



Not sure if many of you are aware, but part of the church's electrical system still uses fuses. We have multiple fuse and circuit breaker boxes. Two of the boxes with fuses are being updated soon however we will still have other boxes that have fuses. We are anticipating having to update the remaining fuse boxes in the not-so-distant future due to requirements by insurance companies. Many companies will not insure buildings that are still using fuses.

Soon it will be time to start the nominating process for Council, Bennett Mutual Fund Treasurer, and Memorial Fund Treasurer positions. If you are interested in being a part of the Nominating Committee this fall or filling one of these positions please come forward. See more information in the newsletter.

A basket raffle with over 70 donated baskets was put together in just a few short days that raised over \$18,000. God's love flows strong in the Rio Community.

As the Senior Choir and the Bell Choir start to practice we thank them for what they add to our church services when they perform. Their gifts, entrusted to them, are truly gifts from God!


We pray for those who are ill. We pray for those who have lost loved ones. We pray for those who suffer from violence. We know that God listens and his will be done!

Boiler Funding Update

As of 9/2/2025, \$11,397 has been raised toward the \$15,000
