God's Word Enlivens Us

John 19:1-16a

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

P: Then Pilate took Jesus and had him flogged. And the soldiers wove a crown of thorns and put it on his head, and they dressed him in a purple robe. They kept coming up to him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" and striking him on the face.

Pilate went out again and said to them, "Look, I am bringing him out to you to let you know that I find no case against him." So Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Pilate said to them, "Here is the man!" When the chief priests and the police saw him, they shouted, "Crucify him! Crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and crucify him; I find no case against him." The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and according to that law he ought to die because he has claimed to be the Son of God."

Now when Pilate heard this, he was more afraid than ever. He entered his headquarters again and asked Jesus, "Where are you from?" But Jesus gave him no answer. Pilate therefore said to him, "Do you refuse to speak to me? Do you not know that I have power to release you, and power to crucify you?" Jesus answered him, "You would have no power over me unless it had been given you from above; therefore the one who handed me over to you is guilty of a greater sin." From then on Pilate tried to release him, but the Jews cried out, "If you release this man, you are no friend of the emperor. Everyone who claims to be a king sets himself against the emperor." When Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus outside and sat on the judge's bench at a place called The Stone Pavement, or in Hebrew Gabbatha.

Now it was the day of Preparation for the Passover; and it was about noon. He said to the Jews, "Here is your King!" They cried out, "Away with him! Away with him! Crucify him!" Pilate asked them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but the emperor."

Then he handed him over to them to be crucified.



THE CRY OF THE WHOLE CONGREGATION Worship for the Way of the Cross

Prelude

1. The Entry Into Jerusalem - The Palm Sunday Procession

NARRATOR: When Jesus drew near to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount that is called Olivet, he sent ahead two of his disciples, saying,

JESUS: "Go into the village opposite. There you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever yet sat; untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' you shall say, 'The Lord has need of it."

NARRATOR: So those who were sent went away and found it as he had told them. And as they were untying the colt, its owners said to them:

PEOPLE: "Why are you untying the colt?"

NARRATOR: And Peter said.

PETER: "The Lord has need of it."

NARRATOR: And they brought it to Jesus, and throwing their garments on the colt, they set Jesus upon it.

And as he rode along, they spread their garments on the road. As he was now drawing near, at the descent of the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to rejoice and to praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works that they had seen, saying:

PEOPLE: "All glory, laud, and honor to you, redeemer, King!"

PROCESSIONAL HYMN ELW #344 "All Glory Laud and Honor"

Refrain: All glory, laud, and honor to you, redeemer, King.

To whom the lips of children made sweet hosannas ring.

- You are the king of Israel and David's royal son, Now in the Lord's name coming, our King and Blessed One. *Refrain*
- 2. The company of angels are praising you on high; Creation and all mortals in chorus make reply. (Refrain)
- 3. The multitude of pilgrims with palms before you went; our praise and prayer and anthems before you we present. (Refrain)
- 4. To you, before your passion, they sang their hymns of praise. To you, now high exalted, our melody we raise. (Refrain)
- 5. Their praises you accepted; accept the prayers we bring, great author of all goodness, O good and gracious King. (Refrain)

NARRATOR: And some of the Pharisees in the multitude cried to him.

PEOPLE: "Teacher, rebuke your disciples! They're calling you the Christ. Tell them to shut up!"

NARRATOR: He answered,

JESUS: "I tell you, if these were silent the very stones themselves would cry out."

(Congregation sits)

NARRATOR: And when he drew near and saw the city he wept over it, saying,

JESUS: "Would that even today you knew the things that make for peace! But now they are hid from your eyes. 0 Jerusalem! The days shall come upon you, when your enemies will cast up a bank about you and surround you, and hem you in on every side. and dash you to the ground, you and your children within you, and they will not leave one stone upon another in you; because you did not know the time of your visitation."

2. The Preparation and the Eating of the Last Supper - The Passion of Our Lord

NARRATOR: Now, the feast of Unleavened Bread drew near, which is called the Passover. And the Temple Priests were seeking how to put Jesus to death; for they feared the people.

Then Satan entered into Judas called Iscariot, who was of the number of the twelve; he went away and conferred with the temple priests and officers how he might betray him to them. And they were glad, and engaged to give him money. So he agreed, and sought an opportunity to betray him to them in the absence of the multitude.

Then came the day of Unleavened Bread, on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. So Jesus sent Peter and John, saying,

JESUS: "Go and prepare the Passover for us, that we may eat it."

NARRATOR: They said to him,

PEOPLE: "But where, Lord? Where will you have us prepare it, and what are we to do?"

NARRATOR: He said to them,

JESUS: "Behold, when you have entered the city. a man carrying a jar of water will meet you; follow him into the house which he enters, and tell the householder, 'The Teacher says to you. Where is the guest room, where I am to eat the Passover with my disciples?' And he will show you a large upper room furnished; there make ready."

NARRATOR: And they went and found it as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover.

NARRATOR: And when the hour came, he sat at the table, and the apostles with him. And he said to them, "I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. For I tell you, I shall not eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God." And he took the cup, and when he had given thanks he said, "Take this and divide it among yourselves; for I tell you that from now on I shall not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes." And he took bread and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." And likewise, the cup after supper, saying, "This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.

Choir Anthem - Lenten Carol

JESUS: "But behold the hand of him who betrays me is with me on the table. For the Son of Man goes as it has been determined: but woe to that man by whom he is betrayed!"

NARRATOR: And they began to question,

PEOPLE: "Who, Lord? Who is to betray you? Is it I? Is it I?"

NARRATOR: He answered,

JESUS: "He who has dipped his hand in the dish with me will betray me. Oh, it would have been better for that man if he had not been born."

NARRATOR: Judas, who betrayed him, said,

JUDAS: "Is it I, Master?"

NARRATOR: Jesus said to him,

JESUS: "You have said so."

NARRATOR: Simon Peter was indignant.

PETER: "But not I! Though they all fall away from you, I will never leave you."

JESUS: "Peter, truly I say to you, this very night, before the cock crows, you will deny me three times."

PETER: "Even if I must die with you, I will never deny you!"

NARRATOR: And so, said all of the disciples, over and over again -

3. The Agony in the Garden - Hymn ELW #347 "Go to Dark Gethsemane" vs. 1

Go to dark Gethsemane, All who feel the tempter's power; Your Redeemer's conflict see, Watch with him one bitter hour; Turn not from his griefs away; Learn of Jesus Christ to pray. NARRATOR: And he came out and went, as was his custom, to the Mount of Olives; and the disciples followed him. And when he came to the place he said to them,

JESUS: "Pray that you may not enter into temptation."

PEOPLE: "Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us, deliver us."

NARRATOR: And he withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and knelt down and prayed,

JESUS: "Father, if thou art willing, remove this cup from me; nevertheless, not my will, but thine be done."

PEOPLE: "Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done. Thy will be done. Thy will be done" -

NARRATOR: When he rose from prayer, he came to the disciples and found them sleeping for sorrow, and he said to them,

JESUS: "Why do you sleep? Rise and pray that you may not enter into temptation."

PEOPLE: "Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, even the evil within ourselves."

NARRATOR: While he was still speaking, there came a crowd, and the man called Judas, one of the twelve, was leading them. He drew near to Jesus to kiss him But Jesus said to him,

JESUS: "Judas, would you betray the Son of Man with a kiss?"

NARRATOR: Judas said,

JUDAS: "Hail, Master."

NARRATOR: When the disciples saw what would follow, they said,

PEOPLE: "Lord, shall we strike with the sword?"

NARRATOR: And one of them struck the slave of the high priest and cut off his right ear. But Jesus said.

JESUS: "No more of this!"

NARRATOR: And he touched his ear and healed him.

PEOPLE: "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.

NARRATOR: Jesus said to those who had come out against him,

JESUS: "When I was with you day after day in the temple, you did not lay hands on me. But this is your hour and the power of darkness."

NARRATOR: Then they seized him –

4. The Judgment - Hymn ELW # 347 "Go to Dark Gethsemane" vs. 2

Follow to the judgment hall, View the Lord of life arraigned; Oh, the wormwood and the gall! Oh the pangs his soul sustained! Shun not suffering, shame or loss; Learn from him to bear the cross.

NARRATOR: Then they seized him and led him away, bringing him to the High Priest's house. Peter followed at a distance; and when they had kindled a fire in the middle of the courtyard and sat down together. Peter sat among them. Then a maid, seeing him sit in the light, said,

MAID: "This man also was with him."

NARRATOR: But he denied it, saying

PETER: "Woman, I do not know him."

NARRATOR: And a little later, someone else saw him and said,

MAN 1: "You also are one of them."

NARRATOR: But Peter said,

PETER: "Man, I am not."

NARRATOR: An hour later another insisted, saying,

MAN 2: "Certainly this man also was with him: for he is a Galilean."

NARRATOR: But Peter said,

PETER: "Man, I do not know what you are saying!"

NARRATOR: And immediately, while he was still speaking, the cock crowed. And the Lord turned and looked at Peter. And Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said to him, "Before the cock crows today, you will deny me three times." And he went out and he wept bitterly.

Now the men who were holding Jesus mocked him and beat him; they blindfolded him and demanded:

PEOPLE: "Prophesy! Who is it that struck you?"

NARRATOR: And they spoke many other words against him, reviling him. When the day came. the assembly of the elders of the people gathered together and led him to their council; and they said.

PEOPLE: "If you are the Christ, tell us."

NARRATOR: But he said to them,

JESUS: "If I tell you, you will not believe; and if I ask you now, you will not answer. But from now on the Son of man shall be seated at the right hand of the power of God""

NARRATOR: And they said,

PEOPLE: "Are you the Son of God. then?"

NARRATOR: And he said to them,

JESUS: "You say that I am."

NARRATOR: And they said,

PEOPLE: "Blasphemy! What further testimony do we need? We have heard it ourselves from his own lips. Blasphemy! Oh. BLASPHEMY!"

5. Dawn Friday: Jesus Before Pilate

NARRATOR: Then the whole company of them arose and brought him before Pontius Pilate.

PEOPLE: And they began to curse him, saying, "We found this man perverting our nation, and forbidding us to give tribute to Caesar, and saying that he himself is Christ the King!"

NARRATOR: And Pilate asked him,

PILATE: "Are you the King of the Jews?"

NARRATOR: And he answered him,

JESUS: "You have said so."

NARRATOR: And Pilate said to the Chief Priests and the multitudes.

PILATE: "I find no crime in this man."

NARRATOR: But they were urgent, saying,

PEOPLE: "He stirs up the people, teaching throughout Galilee even to this place."

NARRATOR: And when Pilate heard that he was a Galilean, of Herod's jurisdiction, he sent him to Herod, where he was vehemently accused, and treated with contempt and mocked, and arrayed in gorgeous purple, and then sent back again. Pilate said to the rulers of the people,

PILATE: "You brought me this man as one who was perverting the people; and after examining him, behold, I did not find him guilty of any of the charges against him. Behold, *nothing* deserving death has been done by him. I will therefore chastise him and release him""

NARRATOR: But they all cried out together,

PEOPLE: "Away with this man! Away! Away! Release to us Barabbas."

NARRATOR: Barabbas was a man who had been thrown into prison for insurrection and for murder. Pilate addressed them once more, desiring to release Jesus. But they shouted out,

PEOPLE: "Crucify him! Crucify him!"

PILATE: "Why? What evil has he done? I've found no crime in him deserving death. I'll chastise him and I'll release him."

NARRATOR: But they were urgent, demanding with loud cries that he should be crucified. And their voices prevailed. So, Pilate gave sentence that their demand should be granted. He released the man who had been jailed for murder. But Jesus he delivered up to their will.

6. Friday Morning: Crucifixion – Hymn ELW #347 "Go to Dark Gethsemane" vs. 3

Calvary's mournful mountain climb; There adoring at his feet, Mark that miracle of time, God's own sacrifice complete.
"It is finished!" Hear him cry; Learn from Jesus Christ to die.

ALL MEN: And as they led him away, they seized one Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, and laid on him the cross, to carry it behind Jesus.

ALL WOMEN: And there followed him a great multitude of women who bewailed and lamented him-

NARRATOR: But Jesus turning to them said,

JESUS: "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children. For behold, the days are coming when they will say, 'Blessed are the barren, and the wombs that never bore, and the breasts that never gave suck!' For if they do this when the wood is green, what will happen when it dries!"







Nicene Creed
