God's Word Enlivens Us

Esther 4:1-17

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

P: When Mordecai learned all that had been done, Mordecai tore his clothes and put on sackcloth and ashes, and went through the city, wailing with a loud and bitter cry; he went up to

the entrance of the king's gate, for no one might enter the king's gate clothed with sackcloth. In every province, wherever the king's command and his decree came, there was great mourning among the Jews, with fasting and weeping and lamenting, and most of them lay in sackcloth and ashes. When Esther's maids and her eunuchs came and told her, the queen was deeply distressed; she sent garments to clothe Mordecai, so that he might take off his sackcloth; but he would not accept them.

Then Esther called for Hathach, one of the king's eunuchs, who had been appointed to attend her, and ordered him to go to Mordecai to learn what was happening and why. Hathach went out to Mordecai in the open square of the city in front of the king's gate, and Mordecai told him all that had happened to him, and the exact sum of money that Haman had promised to pay into the king's treasuries for the destruction of the Jews. Mordecai also gave him a copy of the written decree issued in Susa for their destruction, that he might show it to Esther, explain it to her, and charge her to go to the king to make supplication to him and entreat him for her people. Hathach went and told Esther what Mordecai had said. Then Esther spoke to Hathach and gave him a message for Mordecai, saying, "All the king's servants and the people of the king's provinces know that if any man or woman goes to the king inside the inner court without being called, there is but one law—all alike are to be put to death. Only if the king holds out the golden scepter to someone, may that person live. I myself have not been called to come in to the king for thirty days."

When they told Mordecai what Esther had said, Mordecai told them to reply to Esther, "Do not think that in the king's palace you will escape any more than all the other Jews. For if you keep silence at such a time as this, relief and deliverance will rise for the Jews from another quarter, but you and your father's family will perish. Who knows? Perhaps you have come to royal dignity for just such a time as this." Then Esther said in reply to Mordecai, "Go, gather all the Jews to be found in Susa, and hold a fast on my behalf, and neither eat nor drink for three days, night or day. I and my maids will also fast as you do. After that I will go to the king, though it is against the law; and if I perish, I perish." Mordecai then went away and did everything as Esther had ordered him.



Christmas Tree of Joy

With the above discussion of Joy in mind we have now kicked off the Christmas Tree of Joy to help faithfully provide for the programs/projects of our church putting God first.

A white flocked tree is located in the narthex and displays Christmas bulbs of various colors and snowflakes to represent projects and programs needing a financial boost at our church.

You may take an ornament from the tree any time until December 31, bringing back funds for each ornament chosen. Place the bulb ornament or snowflake in an envelope entitled Bulb or Christmas Tree of Joy and those funds will go specifically for that program or item. Place your envelopes at the back of the church in the narthex in the wicker offertory basket with candy canes. Choose your cane and place it on the tree in the narthex. (If you are unable to pick up an ornament simply write the color of bulb and designation on your envelope).

Each time a bulb/snowflake is returned with a donation, a candy cane will replace it on the tree with the goal of all bulbs being replaced by candy canes by the end of the year.

Snow flakes: represent the utilities of the church, Air conditioning, Heating **Orange Bulb**: Education: bible education programs for children and adults

Blue Bulb: Pastoral: To help fund the pastors salary and needs

<u>Pink Bulb</u>: Evangelism: Programs and projects to reach out to the Rio Community to share as well as mission work spreading the gospel to encourage new members to attend Redeemer <u>Neon Green Bulb</u>: Out Reach: reaching out to our Redeemer members in the community with shared communion, visits to the home bound, the elderly, the sick

<u>Purple Bulb</u>: Social Concerns: Reaching out to the needy in the Rio Community to offer aid and support

Yellow Bulb: New sound system at church as the old one is on its last leg

<u>Dark Green Bulb:</u> Worship to help fund worship needs; salaries of worship staff of organist, choir, bell choir

The Bulb signifies Jesus coming to earth being the Light to Shine out of the darkness. The Candy Canes signify the shepherd's crook, as Jesus is the good shepherd. The white portion of the cane signifies the purity of Christ . The red stripe, signifies the blood of Christ shed for all, through his death and resurrection, He paid the price for our sins.

The snowflake signifies Jesus washing our sins white as snow.
